7TH ANNUAL SUPERFEST OYSTERBOWL MAKES LOCAL CHARITY THE WINNER *Annual event to support JT's Camp Grom in Virginia Beach*

VIRGINIA BEACH, Va. – (January 7, 2014) – The Virginia Gentlemen invite everyone to the 7th Annual Superfest Oysterbowl on February 2 starting at 5 p.m. The 'Super Bowl Party of the Year' is located at Chick's Oyster Bar, 2143 Vista Circle, Virginia Beach.

The annual event combines the excitement of the Super Bowl with an all-you-can-eat barbeque with fixings, oyster roast and happy hour specials throughout the evening. Advance tickets are \$20 and can be purchased at vagentlemen.org or by phone at 757-368-1944. Tickets are \$30 at the door. Sponsorships are also available including reserved tables for all of your friends.

This year's event is presented by Newtown Building Supplies, and other sponsors include Custom Structures, Professional Printing, Colgate Enterprises and Atkinson Realty.

Proceeds from the Superfest Oysterbowl will benefit JT's Camp grom, a 70-acre adventure camp at Birdneck Road and Prosperity Road in Virginia Beach. The Virginia Gentlemen are building the adventure camp and park for children with disabilities, wounded veterans and families of the fallen. The concept includes a lake for fishing with a private beach and cable wakeboarding activities. The camp will also have an indoor pool, outdoor rehabilitative pool, flowrider standing wave, splash park, showers, lockers and a gymnasium and wellness center. An outdoor learning area will be built in addition to an athletic field for archery, putt-putt and other outdoor sports. The entire camp will be wheelchair accessible. JT's Camp Grom will be the only park of its kind on the East Coast.

About Virginia Gentlemen Foundation

The Virginia Gentlemen Foundation, a nonprofit organization, was formed in 2007. It consists of a group of young men who want to make a difference in their community. Josh Thompson, brother of one of the founding members, was diagnosed with ALS or Lou Gehrig's disease in 2008, and initially the organization narrowed its focus to support the local fight against ALS. The Virginia Gentlemen Foundation organizes the annual JT Walk & Beach Party, which has been recognized as the largest single-day walk and

fundraiser for the National ALS Association raising more than \$7 million to date. In 2010, the organization dedicated JT's Grommet Island Beach Park & Playground, a \$2 million oceanfront park in Virginia Beach. In 2012, the organization donated the Grombulance, a mobile intensive-care unit specially designed for children, to Children's Hospital of the Kings Daughters.
